CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) Vaccine and Testing Sites

COVID-19 Vaccine

The COVID-19 vaccine is now available to seniors over the age of 65 in Leon County. To get the vaccine from the Health Department, you can register here tinyurl.com/ycxwjxl4. Once registration is complete you will receive a call from the Leon County Health Department to schedule your appointment.

You can also check with your own physician to see if they are offering the vaccine. Remember that the vaccines require a second dose, so plan accordingly.

The COVID-19 Vaccine currently being offered to Leon County residents age 65 and older is the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine. The Moderna COVID-19 vaccine is administered in **2 doses, 1 month apart**. If you are not comfortable filling out the online registration form, please call the **Leon County Health Department COVID-19 Hotline** at **850-404-6300 option 1** or **850-404-6399**. If you have already completed this form, there is **no need** to re-submit or call the hotline. For questions or concerns about the vaccine visit cdc.gov/vaccines/covid-19/. Even after receiving **both doses** of the vaccine, and until more is understood about the protection the vaccine provides in real-life conditions, it is still important to continue following recommendations for mask wearing, social distancing and hand washing. **If you exhibit symptoms, you should still get tested for the virus.**

COVID-19 Testing Sites

Most **Primary Care Providers** offer testing in their offices and should be the first option you consider. Also, **'Pop-Up' mobile testing sites** can be found at varying locations each week. For more information on mobile testing sites visit the Leon County COVID-19 Information Portal linked below.

Free community testing is available at the **FAMU-Bond Testing Site at Bragg Stadium (1500 Wahnish Way)**. Site is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Mon – Sat; walk-ups accepted, call **850-404-6399** to make appointment.

Ten CVS Pharmacy locations are offering testing (**symptomatic patients only**). Testing is free to the uninsured, but patients must register in advance at CVS.com.

Walgreens Pharmacy (2349 Monroe St. & 2913 Mahan Dr.) is offering testing (**symptomatic patients only**). An insurance and ID card if required and patients must register in advance at walgreens.com.

Patients First: Drive-Thu (535 Appleyard Dr.) testing available Mon – Fri, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Appointments required, and can be scheduled [here](#) or by calling **850-877-7164**. **Curb Side (3446 Thomasville Rd)** open daily from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., schedule appointment [here](#) or call **850-386-2266**. A fee of \$175 may apply.

Wellness Medical Clinic (1931 Welby Way) insurance not accepted, call **850-545-9376** for appointment.

Pixel by LabCorp COVID-19 (At-Home Test Kit) is now available to the public, more information can be found [here](#).

Most health insurance providers are covering the cost of testing, including [Medicare](#), [CHP](#) and [Blue Cross Blue Shield of Florida](#). If you don't have insurance, contact that TMH Transition Center at **850-431-4470** for assistance getting a test.
