In-Home Services: "In-home" care brings services into homes allowing a person with special needs, illness, or disability to remain in their home. Services may include companion care, homemaking, personal care, and even skilled nursing.

Non-Medical Care Services: Provide supervision, companionship, and assistance to elderly or disabled persons, enabling them to perform their activities of daily living such as eating, bathing, and basic mobility. The specific services offered vary with each provider. Contact directly for more information.

The following steps can help you choose the right care arrangement for your loved one:

- Determine the level and frequency of care needed;
- Determine a budget;
- Research and interview companies and/or caregivers. Ask specific questions about services, staffing, schedules, policies, cost, etc.
